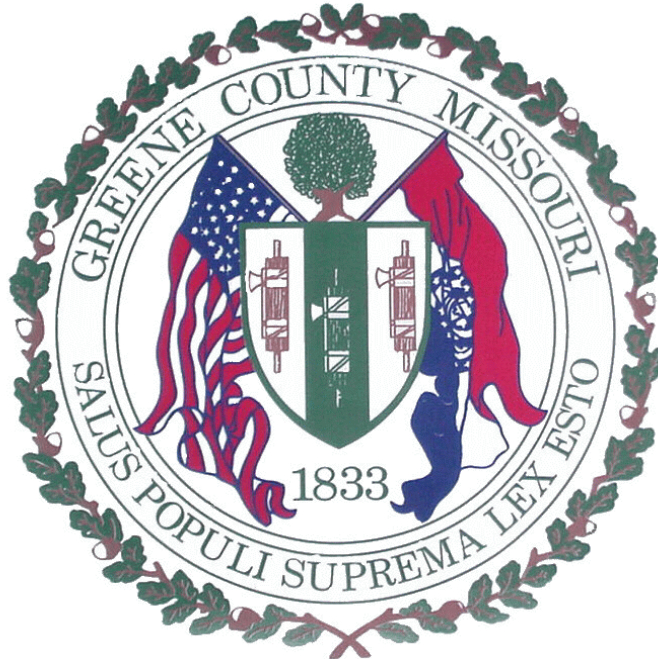

Dear Mark,

This is in reference to transportation federal funding priorities for Greene County in the 2006 appropriations budget. As you know, Greene County, the City of Springfield, and the Springfield Area MPO are in agreement on the top priorities for transportation in our area which are the I-44/US 65 interchange, US 60/US 65 interchange, Business 65/US 60 (Glenstone Avenue/James River Freeway) interchange, and funding to implement a transportation planning study to enhance connectivity within the region and MPO with emphasis on north/south corridors; in that prioritized order. We need to work with our federal delegates to ensure the previous \$65 million, as announced in a press release for the above projects stays in the highway authorization bill.

Previously, Greene County received \$400,000 in direct appropriation to repair a bridge by replacing the deck with an FRP (fiber reinforced polymer) deck. This project will be of national significance since it will also be the first test project utilizing FRP deck and guardrail. Our estimates previously for the project were as follows:

Consultant design	\$50,000
UMR (procure deck and research	\$200,000
Construction Contract (installation and concrete)	\$200,000
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$450,000</b>

In our research with the professors of UMR, they have recommended replacing the steel stringers due to so much section loss from corrosion. They also feel replacing the beams will save money for the life cost of the project and give the FRP deck a fair test. Not replacing the beams will involve sandblasting the lead based paint and repairing the beams. We have found capturing the lead based paint and repairing the steel beams is very costly. We propose to install new weathering steel composite beams. With this proposed recommendation from UMR, our estimates have been adjusted as follows:


Consultant design	\$50,000
UMR (procure deck, research, and testing)	\$285,000
Construction Contract (installation, concrete, and supply steel I-girders)	\$250,000
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$585,000</b>

We are seeking an additional \$185,000 to fully fund this project. We are currently in the process of executing agreements between the Greene County Commission and the Missouri Department of Transportation for the release of the funds through FHWA. We have signed our consultant agreement and the proposed agreement between the Greene County Commission and the University of Missouri-Rolla is under review. The project is expected to go to construction this summer.
