In the event of an emergency or disaster, cities help each other out with needed equipment. Natalie Scrivner, city clerk, said belonging to the network does not cost the city anything and being a member could help with FEMA and SEMA reimbursements after a disaster. City superintendent Raymond Heryford said it was very similar to fire mutual aid already practiced in the county. "It's like the fire departments. When Cap-linger needs help, Stockton goes." Heryford said.

- July 21, 2010, *Marshfield Mail* (Marshfield, Niangua, Seymour and Rogersville, Missouri), **Marshfield safe room going up soon**

When Marshfield's safe room is finished later this year, it will be the fourth such facility in Webster County. Marshfield City Administrator Dan McMillan said construction will begin after the fair ends this week and will quickly, with precast concrete walls.

"One day you will go by there, and there's a foundation. The next day, there are walls and a roof," McMillan said Monday, July 12. "Then, it slows down again when they're detailing inside."

Combined, the Marshfield, Niangua, Seymour and Rogersville emergency storm shelters will serve 2,700 people at a cost of more than \$2 million.

- July 21, 2010, Siemens.Com (Missouri), **Update on Virus Affecting Simatic WinCC SCADA Systems**

Siemens was notified about the malware program (Trojan) that is targeting the Siemens software Simatic WinCC and PCS 7 on July 14.

The following has so far been established: A malware program (Trojan), which spreads via USB sticks and uses a Microsoft security breach, is targeting the Siemens software Simatic WinCC and PCS 7. Just viewing the contents of the USB stick can activate the Trojan. Siemens recommends avoiding the use of a USB stick.

Chemical Industry Sector

- July 21, 2010, *Homeland Security News* (National), **DHS initiates first enforcement action of chemical plant safety regulations**

DHS initiated its first enforcement actions against U.S. chemical facilities under federal anti-terrorism law; the department sent letters to 18 chemical facilities warning that their failure to comply with safety regulations may result in heavy fines or worse; the administrative orders sent to the facilities represent the final step before the department begins prosecution; under the law, DHS can assess fines of up to \$25,000 per day for failure to comply; in addition, the law gives the department authority to shut down a chemical facility if its owners fail to respond to DHS requirements for security improvements; for security reasons, DHS declined to identify the 18 facilities or to indicate the types of sites involved or even where they are generally located.
